The Cristo Vive (Christ Lives) Evangelical Community Church of Púquio, in an assembly held for all of its members, elected to name brother Erwin García as the congregation's new pastor. He and his wife led the church in its spiritual development and growth, and continued the evangelism and discipleship program while working with the NETS project. ### **Workshop for NETS Project Leaders**

From April 12-14, Pastor Eloy Mollo held a workshop in the Púquio community entitled "Discipleship Training for Leaders." Thirty people attended, and the workshop's goal was to challenge brothers and sisters to form small groups for discipleship using the program's book *Until We All Arrive*.

Each year the partners will receive the production of the males keeping the females, and at the end they will distribute them equally.

Sister Natividad Ipamo de García was in charge of the event, whose theme was "An Exemplary Woman." There were contests, games, and other activities, and all had a very good time.



## Monterito Has a Pastor

The Cristo Viene (Christ is Coming) Evangelical Church in Monterito chose a new pastor. The new pastor is brother Nicolás Pesa, who is a graduate of the Alborada de Guayaramerin Beni institute, thanks to the support he received from the First Baptist Church of New Castle. His wife, Josefina, will work with the children. Nicolás will have the work and challenge of carrying out the construction and development of the church, as well as reaching out to neighbors in the community.



## A Truck's Role in Ministry...

The truck has spent five years serving in ministry in the Ñuflo de Chávez area, transporting people to attend congresses, workshops, and camps, as well as transporting various materials for construction projects. It also has been used for social work in Concepción.

The sisters continue working in the orchard and already are making good use of the manioc, peanuts, potatoes, and vegetables.
